OUR STORY

The history of our church is a long one, but in many ways we're a church that has been re-founded more recently. The Lord's faithfulness and providence has been seen throughout and is still our hope today.

St. Elmo Presbyterian Church (SEPC) was founded in 1889 by First Presbyterian Church in the new township of St. Elmo, Tennessee, located at the foot of Lookout Mountain. The Civil War was not long past, including the Battle of Chickamauga, one of the most significant conflicts of the war and fought less than 10 miles from St. Elmo.

Throughout its history, the church has relied on the Lord during times of trial and blessing. In 1891, the church treasurer notoriously skipped town, absconding with church funds and the church secretary. In the early 1900s, SEPC founded Lookout Mountain Presbyterian Church, which is now one of the leading churches in the area and is planting churches of their own. God has been faithful throughout the history of SEPC, especially during a wonderful period of revitalization with pastor Cal Boroughs.

In the years prior to Cal's arrival, the church had fallen on hard times. The St. Elmo neighborhood was in visible decline, and the church was losing members. SEPC had been through several pastors and had shrunk to 40 members. It was only budgeting six months at a time since church giving was at an all-time low. People were discouraged. In 1986 the congregation held a vote on whether to continue.

In 1987, the church narrowed down their pastoral search to two men, Cal and another candidate. Cal was without a call and had been away from full-time ministry for some years, a challenging and humbling time in his life. SEPC decided to call the other pastor, who left in 1990. Instead of going through a new pastoral search, the church chose to extend a call to Cal Boroughs who began his ministry at St. Elmo in August of 1990.

Cal's pastoral gifts revived the church and helped nurture a church home that was welcoming to young families moving to the St. Elmo area. SEPC became an oasis of nourishment and refreshment for weary believers who were ministering in other fields, primarily education.

Over the first 10 years of Cal's pastorate at SEPC, the church blossomed as new members joined and as covenant children were born. By the early 2000s, there were over 70 children in the church. In the early 2010s, the congregation added a fellowship hall, expanded Sunday school rooms, and remodeled most of the downstairs. The Lord's faithfulness to the congregation was palpable in the growth and vitality of the church throughout Cal's ministry.

Cal retired in August 2020, after 30 years of faithful service to our church. Despite the Covid-19 pandemic and the sadness of our beloved pastor's retirement, we rejoiced at how God had taken such good care of the congregation. That good care has continued with the arrival of Bill Massey, our interim minister.

SEPC exists in close proximity to several other churches in the Chattanooga area, many of them in the PCA. SEPC is also near two Christian educational institutions with which the church has strong partnerships and connections—Covenant College (the college of the PCA) and Chattanooga Christian School, a K-12 institution. Many church members are employed at these institutions as tenured professors and teachers, and SEPC draws students from both.

Since many people from SEPC are not from this area, the church feels like a second family. During each Sunday worship service, there is devoted time for impromptu prayer requests, which adds to the “family” character. This community ethos also spills over into a strong mercy ministry focus, so that over the decades we have supported numerous ministries in the broader community (including Shepherd’s Arms Mission, Widows Harvest Ministries, and Channels of Love). Our church has also sponsored a Boy Scout troop with several boys participating every year. And historically, we’ve had a strong missionary impulse, with many church members ending up in the mission field as long-term missionaries.

We are currently a congregation and a neighborhood in transition. SEPC has been a “parish” church serving members living in St. Elmo, but now it serves people from surrounding areas, including North Georgia. The neighborhood property values have skyrocketed and a less churched group of residents has moved into the local community. Our church looks forward to better understanding these transitions and how we can best serve and reach this rapidly changing community. We are excited to see how the Lord’s plan will unfold.

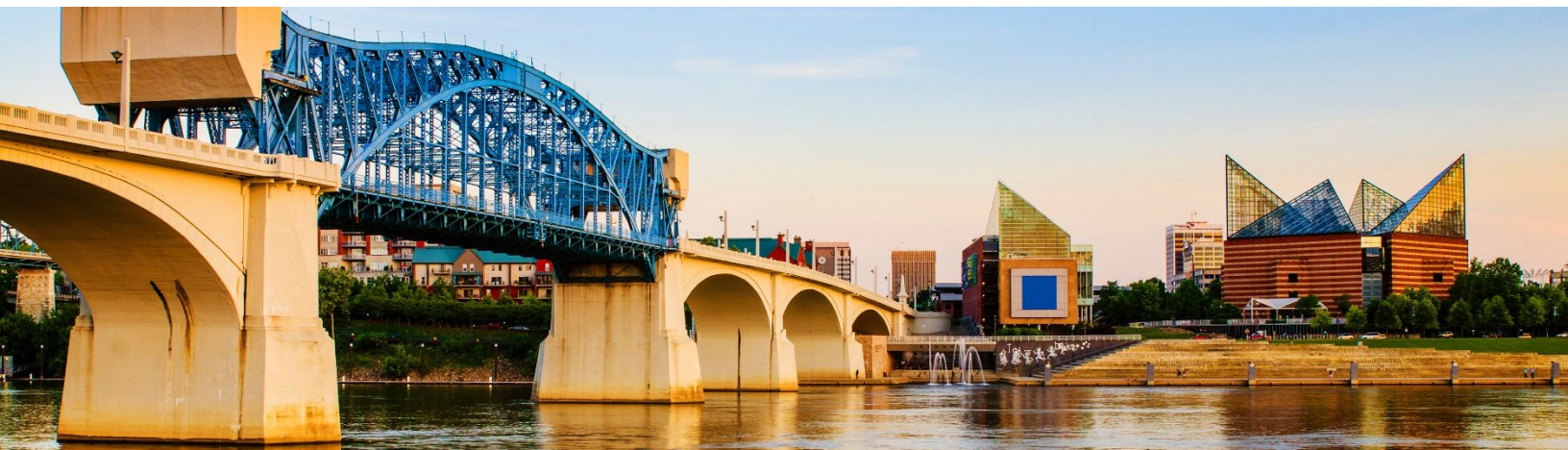


OUR SETTING

St. Elmo Presbyterian Church is in the historic district of St. Elmo within the city boundaries of Chattanooga, Tennessee. Chattanooga is a growing, mid-size city in East Tennessee, known for its history, outdoors, entrepreneurial spirit, and high-speed Internet access. US News and World Report ranked Chattanooga as one of the best places to live based on quality of life and people's desire to live there. Chattanooga is near other major cities such as Atlanta, Nashville, Knoxville, and Asheville. With Tennessee's zero state income tax and a lower cost of living than other cities, Chattanooga is attracting more people to the area.

St. Elmo is experiencing a period of growth and transition as young families and single professionals move into the neighborhood. With this transition, St. Elmo has seen an abundance of new housing and home improvements along with new retail development and up-and-coming restaurants, all within walking distance, making this neighborhood a unique place to minister.

Chattanooga is known for its outdoors, with many hiking trails (easy access to the Appalachian and Cumberland Trails), rock climbing, and even an Ironman competition. Kayaking and paddleboarding the Tennessee River are a popular weekend activity as well as hang gliding from Lookout Mountain. Chattanooga possesses a vibrant city life with several music festivals, including Riverbend and Moon River. Major attractions that delight visitors and locals alike include the Hunter Museum of American Art, the Tennessee Aquarium, Ruby Falls, Rock City, and the Incline. All of this attracts both locals and visitors to this growing city.

QUALIFICATIONS

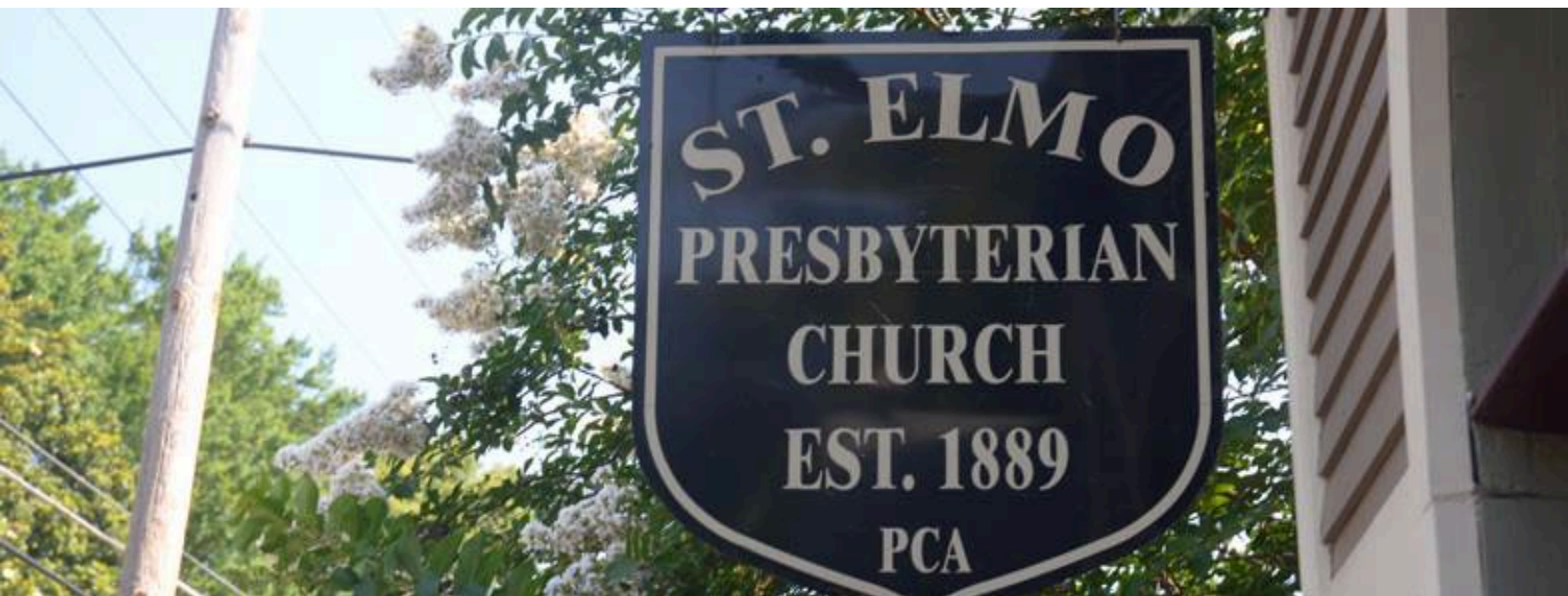
- M.Div. and/or D.Min.

- Strong biblical character that consistently exhibits spiritual maturity, integrity, purity, and humility with a prayerful dependence on God and a life above reproach
- Ministry and vision that understands and embraces the mission and vision of St. Elmo Presbyterian Church and is willing to expand and enrich that understanding both within the church (internal) and in the local community and beyond (external)

- Expository preaching with a commitment to Reformed theology as expressed in the Westminster Confession of Faith
