


Eritrea and Ethiopia have a complex relationship. They ended a twenty-year conflict with each other in 2018. Just two years later, Eritrean soldiers joined Ethiopia in a fight against a paramilitary group in Ethiopia's Tigray region. That conflict ended in 2022, but unrest has spiked in Tigray again this month, concerning many about the region's long-term stability.

This international narrative has created a fascinating *global Bible translation team* for the Kunama of Eritrea. Meg Hunt with Wycliffe USA says about the Kunama, "They have for decades experienced hardship through civil war in their country. Many of them have migrated to neighboring countries — and then actually several of them have come to North America." Two Kunama teams in North America and Ethiopia connect across time zones and schedules to translate God's Word. The team in Ethiopia faces especial challenges. "They are being targeted by the local government, so it's been hard for them to continue to feel safe in that environment." Find your place in the full story at mnnonline.org.

¹Jesus entered Jericho and was passing through. ²A man was there by the name of Zacchaeus; he was a chief tax collector and was wealthy. ³He wanted to see who Jesus was, but being a short man he could not, because of the crowd. ⁴So he ran ahead and climbed a sycamore-fig tree to see him, since Jesus was coming that way. ⁵When Jesus reached the spot, he looked up and said to him, "Zacchaeus, come down immediately. ¹⁰For the Son of Man came to seek and to save what was lost."




II. Zacchaeus - And Found

2. Who is seeking whom in this story? Is Zacchaeus seeking Jesus or is Jesus seeking Zacchaeus?







After Jesus died and was buried, His disciples and friends were full of grief and despair.
